Answer all the following questions for each paper. Don't worry right now about "surface errors" (spelling, punctuation, etc.); let the author do her/his own proofreading. Your job here is to give spot more substantial.

## **Individual Article Reviews**

- 1. Considering you have not read the articles, how easy was it to understand what the authors did?
- 2. What are some examples of where your fellow student was very clear in describing aspects of the articles? (Please be specific)
- 3. What are some examples of where you did not understand what the authors did? Please explain why you feel this way and what additional information/rewording you think would help clarify the points?
- 4. What are some examples of times when your fellow student makes a very insightful and/or important observation about the articles? This could pertain to (1) a limitation of ways that the article can be used to guide further decisions or generalizations to other circumstance, (2) an error in the authors' reasoning and/or methods, or (3) an important implication for the interventions or assessments.

## **Summary Paragraph(s)**

- 5. How well were the various ideas and conclusions from the individual articles brought together to make over-arching conclusions?
- 6. How well did he/she support the conclusions and connections he/she made?

- 7. Is your fellow student better at presenting ideas/information succinctly or clearly?

- 9. What one thing should your fellow student focus on first to improve her/his writing?
